




Big Thompson Confluence Mitigation Bank



404 Stream and Wetland Mitigation


The 2008 Mitigation Rule defines:

Impact Hierarchy

- Avoid
- Minimize
- Mitigate

Mitigation Hierarchy

- Mitigation bank
- In-lieu fee program
- Permittee responsible mitigation



404 Compensatory Mitigation Bank

- Restoration occurs before impacts
- Credits
- Large scale projects; ideally located
- Ensured performance
- Service area




404 In-Lieu Fee Program

- Restoration occurs after impacts
- Credits
- Potential for large scale projects
- Ensured performance
- Service area



404 Permittee Responsible Mitigation

- Closer proximity to impacts
- Specific project
- Permittee responsible for project success
- Less regulatory oversight



SB 19-181

- Signed & Effective April 16, 2019
- Form 2 & 2A
- Requires consideration/mitigation of certain wildlife (Rule 1200)
- Rule 1200 Mitigation:
 - Direct Impact Habitat Mitigation Fee
 - Compensatory Mitigation Plan




CPW High Priority Habitat


